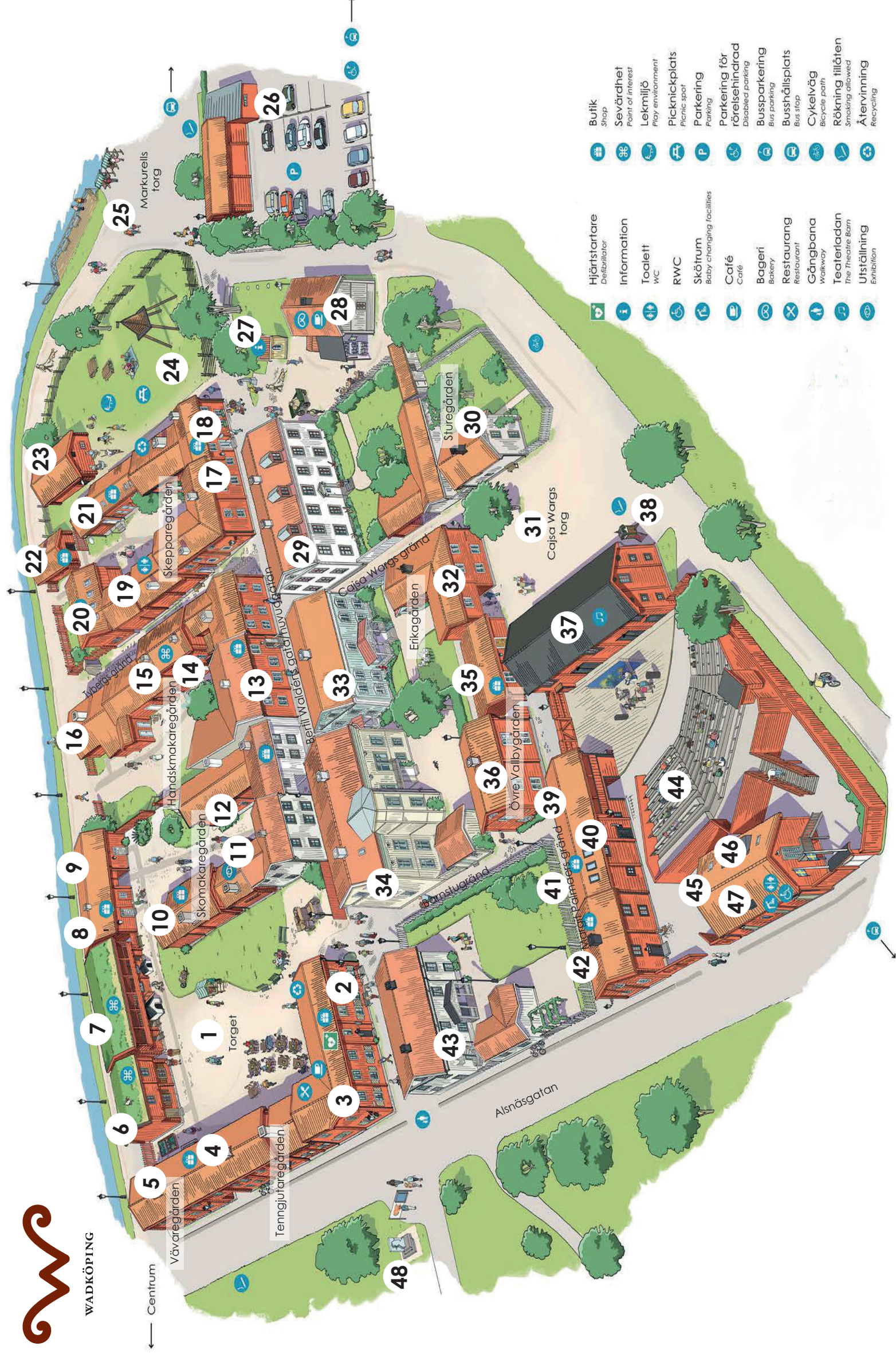

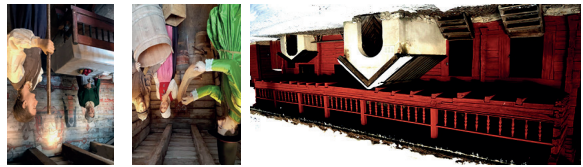

The Burgher's House was built in the 1600's and was bought by Anders Warg, father of famous cookbook author "Cajsa" Christina Warg, in the 1700's. Today the Burgher's House is a museum.



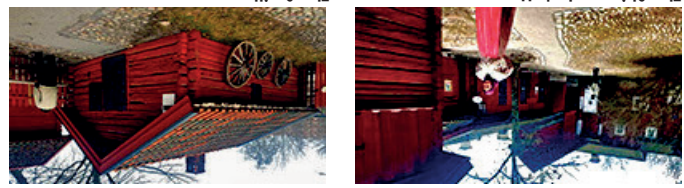
The King's Lodge is the oldest building in Örebro. It was moved here in 1899. Duke Karl who was crowned King Karl IX in 1604, is said to have visited the lodge in 1580 and 1581. On the top floor there are beautiful wall and ceiling murals preserved. Nowadays The King's Lodge is a museum.



The Pewter's House was built in the 1780's and served as home and workshop to pewtermiths. Today you find a restaurant and an old style corner shop in here.



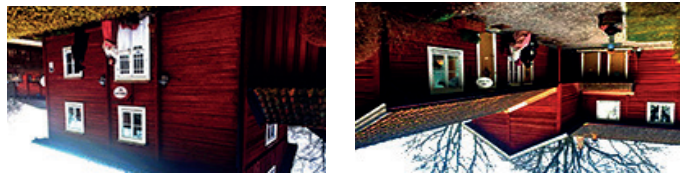
The Shipmaster's House was built in the 1700's when sea trade was important in Örebro and was earlier used as a farm smithy. Today there is an exhibition and is open mainly during the summer and market days.



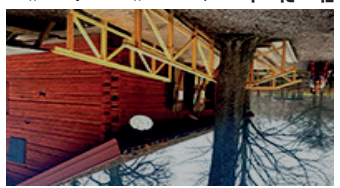
The Jernmich Cottage was built sometime around the turn of the 19th century. The well renowned poet Levi Rickson, also known as Jernmich the Inconsolable, has lived in the house. Today it is a bakery.



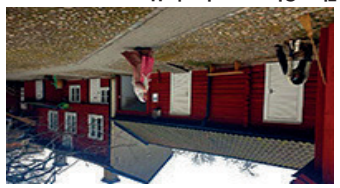
Upper Valley House is a typical "Närke Cottage" from the 1800's. Today the Wadköping administration has it's quarters in this house.



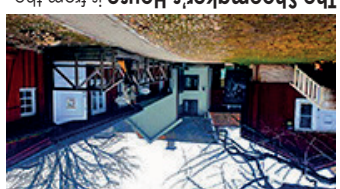
The Playbar is an outhouse from the 1800's. Today it is used as a creative play space for children with a miniature corner shop, a playhouse and a farm with wooden animals.



The Glove-maker's House was built in the 1700's and has had many tenants. Today there are museums, a puppet theatre and private dwellings here.



The Shoemaker's House is from the 1600's. Back then it could be as many as 120 people living here at the same time. Today there are shops, museums and a private dwelling here.
